Following letter is sent to you for the favour of publication in your esteemed Paper, as it touches the current topic of the famous Gandhi-Jinnah Meeting.

Gandhi-Jinnah Meeting is being anxiously awaited by all eyes of the public in India. It has drawn attention of the whole world - ever. Whether the Meeting by itself will lead to freedom or not, cannot be said, but it is certain that the Meeting is bound to have far-reaching effects on not only international relations but also on Indo-British relations and on the future of Indian freedom. The responsibility, therefore, of both the great sons of India is heavy indeed.

In view of this heavy responsibility and far-reaching consequences, vitally affecting the Indian People it is necessary that such a procedure be adopted in the conduct of the negotiation in the event of its failure the points of agreement and differences are clearly and unambiguously brought out for the eyes of the public at large, enabling it to form its own judgment on merit. In the event of its success due should be kept in adjustment so that the agreed formula be placed before an early Convention for consideration and approval. It can be justly hoped that with Gandhi-Jinnah endorsement there will be no major hitch from freedom-loving quarters.

However an important issue <sup>of this</sup> deserves attention of all. It has been pointed out by Mr. Jinnah that the Unity-Talks on the basis of Rajaji's formula cannot be conclusive without the agreement on the plan of interim National Government. Similarly it was clear that the entire picture of the free India cannot be completed without agreement on the future of Indian States and Statelets. The problem of the States is going to assume serious proportions as are long, and it is absolutely necessary that the different States and Parties of the Indian People agree upon the future Constitution of India, so that the necessary forces be successfully faced."
