Your Exalted Highness,

Many thanks for your letter of the 29th May, and for your kind enquiries about my health. I am glad to inform you that I am alright now and have returned to Bombay.

There are many points in Your Exalted Highness's letter which require further discussion and I can only say that I

am likely to come to Hyderabad on a professional engagement

I will inform Your Exalted Highness of the date, when I think it will be possible for us to deal and discuss the

matter further. In the meantime I trust that neither your Government nor Nawab Bahadur Yar Jung will do anything which will add to the difficult situation that has been created,

although I feel that after a personal talk with Your Exalted Highness the matter can be satisfactorily settled, for I

believe strongly that Nawab Bahadur Yar Jung has no intention of causing anything detrimental, in the first instance to

Your Exalted Highness or to the British Government; and if I am right in that view then the solution is not difficult.

However we will discuss the matter further when we meet.
