Dear Nawab Bahadur Yar Jung,

I have received your telegrams as well as your letter delivered to me by hand but I have not received the copy of the rules referred to in your telegram. I have been in communication and am awaiting a reply. In the meantime I can only repeat my advice which I gave you at Mandi that nothing should be done by you or by Ittihadul Muslimeen which would in any way force the government to take any action.

All the talk between us and the correspondence must be kept strictly confidential. If necessary you can tell the people that you saw me at Mandi and that I will give my very close attention to the situation; and pending that nothing should be done which would make the situation more difficult. Beyond that you should not refer to any thing else which has taken place between you and me and give a version of it which may not correctly represent the situation and may lead to misunderstanding.

I will strongly urge upon you to have patience. Nothing is going to happen but any wrong step may create a very serious situation.
